The Kidney Foundation of Ohio is dedicated to providing a broad-based program of direct assistance to those with kidney disease and promoting and providing educational programming for the general public, renal professionals, and patients and their families. It is our goal that all people with renal disease or transplant recipients will be accepted in the community and have a measurably improved quality of life and function as a result of the services provided by the Kidney Foundation of Ohio.

The Foundation serves a thirty-two county area in northern and eastern Ohio and supports two affiliate chapters in Lake and Summit Counties. There are five counties supported by the organization in West Virginia to assist individuals who cross into Ohio for treatment.

What began as a small group of families and physicians has become the premier agency in Ohio for providing direct assistance and education to those suffering from the effects of kidney failure. The Kidney Foundation remains the only health and human services agency in Northeast Ohio which continues to provide direct dollars to patients to assist through the devastation of kidney disease.

## **DIRECT ASSISTANCE PROGRAMS**

The following programs are free to qualified kidney patients within the Foundation's service area

#### Medication

We provide financial aid to help individuals purchase renal medications. Approved program participants receive funding to purchase medications through an approved pharmacy. Priority is given to people who have no other form of assistance, such as Medicaid, Medicare, or private insurance.

#### **Transportation**

We provide financial aid to pay for safe, reliable, and affordable transportation to and from dialysis or transplant appointments. The maximum reimbursement is \$50.00/month, paid bi-monthly. In emergency situations, bus passes and cab vouchers are issued to patients. Priority is given to individuals who travel long distances.

#### **Emergency Grant**

An emergency grant, available once a year, can be issued when an incident occurs that has an impact on the patient's life and no other assistance is available. Unexpected high utility bills, auto repairs, and medical supplies are often situations where emergency grants are awarded.

#### **Emergency Insulin**

An emergency supply of insulin syringes, or pen needles is provided to approved applicants. To qualify, patients must have a diagnosis of diabetes and live in Cuyahoga County. Priority will be given to those who are uninsured or underinsured. A diagnosis of kidney disease is not required.

## **SUPPORTIVE SERVICES**

#### **Case Management**

Living with Chronic Kidney Disease requires significant lifestyle adjustments for patients and their families. This may cause individuals to feel helpless or overwhelmed, inhibiting the person's ability to follow treatment guidelines, and resulting in poor medical outcomes. We provide support to patients and families, allowing them to take control of their health for better management and outcomes.

#### **Medical Identification Bands**

The Foundation provides personalized medical alert bands to renal patients in our service area at no cost.

## **EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMS**

#### **Renal Symposium**

This two day, interdisciplinary conference for renal professionals focuses on current trends and features nationally recognized experts in the field of renal health care.

#### **Healthy Teens, Healthy Tomorrow: Teen Summit**

This program offers minority teens comprehensive education and information regarding positive lifestyle choices and risk factors contributing to chronic illness.

#### **Learning Series**

In partnership with University Hospitals Transplant Institute, the Kidney Foundation of Ohio offers educational sessions on topics relevant to dialysis and transplant healthcare professionals.

#### **Educational Scholarship**

Financial support ranging between \$1,000-\$3,000 are provided to a student who has been diagnosed with kidney disease (or child of a kidney patient), demonstrates financial need and resides in the Foundation's service area.

#### **Health Fairs**

These interactive fairs are designed for outreach to provide basic preventive education and medical screenings to community members.

#### Speaker's Bureau

Staff and trained volunteers are available to speak to corporate employees, church groups, or schools about the signs, symptoms, and causes of kidney disease.
