As the Foundation continues its journey to build a healthier community, we are honored that you have chosen us as a partner, supporter, and friend.

Over the past 74 years, the Foundation has grown its service area and broad-based programs for the general public, renal professionals, patients and their families. As a result of our efforts, we hope that individuals affected by kidney disease will attain a measurably improved quality of life, and that we can bring awareness to the devastation of kidney disease in our community.

I'd like to share some inspirational highlights from the year:

- 1,396 people were assisted, an increase over the year prior by 120 patients.
- Provided food gift cards to patients who lost electricity during the summer tornadoes
- Paid for plow services during snow storms in Ashtabula County, to ensure patients driveways were cleared so they could make it to their dialysis appointments
- Established an Advocacy Committee

I admire and respect how our volunteers, donors, and leadership have come together to address the needs around health of our community. Their involvement allowed us to help our patients with medication assistance, transportation reimbursement, and emergency funding, and surrounded our patients with the care they needed to sustain and improve their health. We maintained strong and unwavering support to those who needed us the most.

MISSION

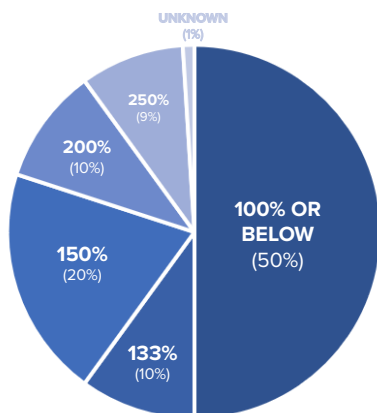
We are dedicated to providing a broad-based program of direct assistance to persons with kidney disease and promoting and providing educational programming for the general public, renal professionals, and patients and their families.



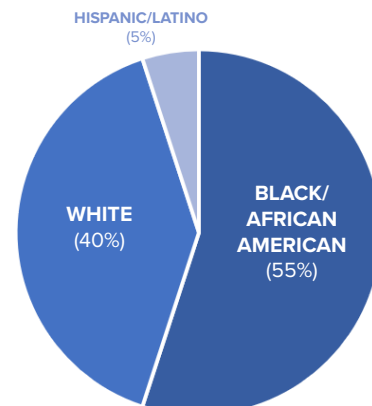
PURPOSE

Patients utilizing our services will experience a reduction or removal of the financial barrier to life-sustaining medication, transportation, or support during an emergency situation.

PATIENT ASSISTANCE PROGRAMS

MEDICATION ASSISTANCE

This program provides financial aid to help individuals purchase life-saving renal medications and nutritional supplements through an approved pharmacy. In emergency situations, gift cards are distributed to local pharmacies to receive immediate medications.

*Medication Assistance includes **Emergency Insulin** for diabetics who have run out of their medication and are unable to access another supply.*

TRANSPORTATION ASSISTANCE

Patients require safe, reliable, and affordable transportation to and from dialysis and/or transplant appointments. Many kidney patients do not qualify for other community-based assistance; the services are cost prohibitive, or transit schedules are not conducive to a patient who is ill after a scheduled dialysis treatment. Qualified and enrolled participants receive mileage reimbursement paid bi-monthly directly to the individual. In emergency situations, bus passes, cab vouchers, and gasoline gift cards are issued when no other support is available.

EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE

To help lessen the financial burden of kidney disease, an emergency grant, available once a year, is issued to an individual when an incident occurs (high utility bill, auto repair) that has an impact on the patient's life. Emergency Assistance includes the Giving Tree during the holiday season. Due to extreme weather events, the Foundation assisted in non-traditional ways such as providing fast food gift cards to those who lost electricity during tornadoes, and paying for plow services after a big snow storm to ensure patients could get out of their driveways to get to treatments.

SUPPORTIVE SERVICES

INFORMATION & REFERRAL

Living with Chronic Kidney Disease requires significant lifestyle adjustments for patients and their families. This may cause individuals to feel helpless or overwhelmed, inhibiting the person's ability to follow treatment guidelines, resulting in poor medical outcomes. We provide support to patients and families allowing them to take control of their health, finances, and resources for better management and outcomes.

MEDICAL IDENTIFICATION BANDS

Personalized bands that include patient's treatment type, and the location of their access are provided at no cost. A wallet-sized medical alert card is included that lists the individual's doctor's name and telephone number, allergies, and medical conditions. In emergency situations, the identification band easily alerts first responders to the location of an individual's access. We distributed 217 bands in 2024.

PROFESSIONAL EDUCATION

LEARNING SERIES

Educational webinar sessions were hosted for healthcare professionals to provide resources to better serve patients. Nearly 200 people attended three sessions in 2024.

49TH ANNUAL RENAL SYMPOSIUM



The two-day interdisciplinary conference featured nationally recognized experts in the field of renal healthcare, and addressed the latest issues and trends in dialysis and transplantation. Nearly 250 renal professionals attended including Dialysis Technicians, Dietitians, Nurses, Transplant Coordinators, and Social Workers.

COMMUNITY EDUCATION & AWARENESS

The Foundation attends community events and health fairs year-round to provide education to community members on how to minimize risk or slow progression of kidney disease, and to share information on our programs and services.

In March, in honor of **World Kidney Day** and National Kidney Month, we held a resource fair at Dave's Market & Eatery in Midtown. Attendees visited with vendors, received information on nutrition related to kidney-disease, enjoyed food, giveaways and more (pictured below).



In partnership with Cleveland MOTTEP, and Boys & Girls Clubs of Cleveland, **Youth Summits** were held in the Summer and Fall.

Kids aged 5-18 attended presentations with information on chronic illnesses and the importance of organ and tissue donation, enjoyed cooking demonstrations on proper diet and healthy cooking, and took part in a yoga session.



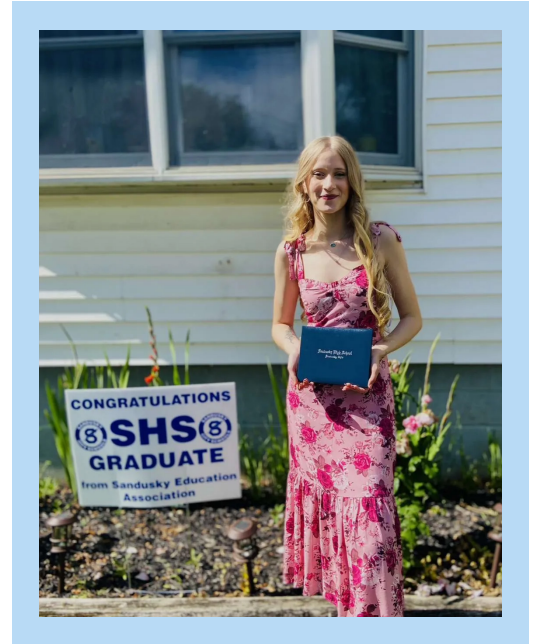
SCHOLARSHIP RECIPIENTS

An Educational Scholarship helps a deserving kidney patient, or child of a patient, achieve his/her academic goals and complete a college education or technical school. Two new recipients were selected in 2024.

ISABELLA

Isabella's dad was diagnosed with colorectal cancer in 2019, but beat it within a year through chemotherapy and radiation, and having his colon and bladder removed. In 2022, he was diagnosed with stage 4 kidney disease. Unfortunately, he does not qualify for a kidney transplant because of the colorectal cancer and will eventually need dialysis treatments. She expressed that the past few years for her and her family have been hard knowing there is not much they can do to help, but they are staying positive and creating memories as a family while they can.

Isabella currently works part-time as a Patient Care Technician and attends Bowling Green State University Firelands School of Nursing. She hopes to give back to the transplant community because she wants others to be able to receive transplants that her dad is not able to.



ABIGAIL

Abigail's dad started dialysis in 2019, and had to stop working during that time, which financially impacted their family. Abigail said it also impacted her relationship with her dad because she wasn't able to see him as often. He fortunately received a kidney transplant in 2021. Post-transplant, she says he is healthier than ever and their bond has grown stronger!

Abigail completed over 150 hours of community service during high school, was involved with marching and concert band, and played lacrosse. She attends Cuyahoga County Community College with hopes to transfer to receive her Bachelors Degree once she decides on a major.



In total, 7 scholarships were funded in 2024.

SPECIAL EVENTS



The **32nd ANNUAL GALA** honored the 2024 Person of the Year, Dr. Emilio Poggio, and presented the Lifetime Achievement Award to Dr. Romeo Miclat. The event raised **\$183,000**.
